Why garagErasmus Cities?

1) More people are coming

- With the growth of the number of European Universities, mobility has gone up;
- In the last 5 years, the number of foreign students in Italy increased by 23% (MUR);
- Erasmus students in particular increased by 30% (Erasmus+);
- In the academic year 2021/22, against 1.8M students enrolled in Italian universities, there were 750K requests for accommodation from foreign or non-resident students, of which less than 5% were satisfied by dorms.





Why garagErasmus Cities?

2) Prices are going up

- Officially in Italy the price of rents has risen by 7,2% since May 2022 and by 14,5% since May 2021 (ISTAT) making it unaffordable for students, trainees or young professionals to live there;
- In 2022 rents in Milan reached peaks of 1800€
 per month on average for a one-bedroom
 apartment, against an average Erasmus+ study
 grant of €300 and work placement grant of
 €400.





Why garagErasmus Cities?

3) Need of social inclusion:

• Erasmus students and interns rarely engage with local communities and both groups close themselves to the other.





Our solution: a tailor made Erasmus students area

An Erasmus City will offer:



An affordable housing alternative for students with all comfort included (Wi-fi, gym, studio and co-working areas).

A social incubator

Common spaces and activities fostering linguistic and social exchange, allowing students to build synergies with the people from the neighborhood (activities with adults, teenagers and children).




An inclusive option for students with rents up to 40% cheaper than current market prices in big cities.



Many activities facilitating the working life such as workshops, seminars and projects will be organised. Moreover, current and former Erasmus+ students will be given the chance to network and put their ideas into practice.



The neighbourhood



- garag = RASMUS

- It is located in the south-eastern outskirts of Milan.
- In 1970s, important settlements of council housing were built.
- The two parts into which the district is divided do not communicate with each other.
- It is disconnected with the rest of Milan's urban and social network.
- The strategic and urban planning choices in recent years have not succeeded in reversing this trend, nor in giving the neighbourhood a chance to develop as a healthy and dynamic community.

Renzo Piano's Laboratory

- Designed by Renzo Piano, the 'Neighbourhood Laboratory' seems to represent a turning point in the long process of regeneration of Ponte Lambro.
- The "laboratory", placed at the centre of the area's regeneration efforts, was supposed to mend and harmonise the social fabric through a mix of services and facilities for the community.
- The project was interrupted several times and finally ground to a halt in January 2015, leaving the building in a state of disrepair.





What has been done so far?

Erasmus City @PonteLab

The first tailor-made Erasmus students area in Europe!



The project aims at revitalizing the neighborhood by bringing together international students and the local community.

- 1) The project aims at continuing an idea by Renzo Piano;
- 2) It includes the development of 200 beds with 50 co-working stations, local businesses and social activities;
- 3) €10MM total investment;
- 4) The expected launch is on September 2025.

20 Erasmus Cities by 2040 (in Italy and Europe)


