UNICOMM PROJECT: WHY?

AIM: Identify factors supporting inclusive student participation, strengthen competences for active engagement, and create guidelines for higher education institutions in times of uncertainty and change.

IDEA: Higher education is more than courses and research. All members of the academic community should feel valued, motivated, and engaged in meaningful initiatives.

MOTIVATION: Restore students' sense of belonging and agency after long periods of online study and uncertainty about the future of education.

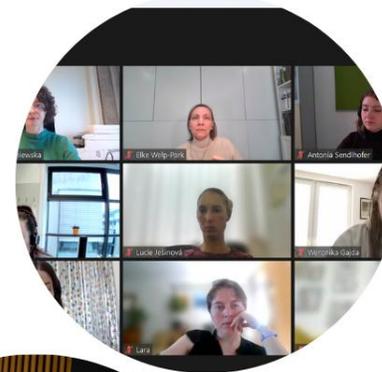

WHY the project was developed

The project was designed to strengthen the role of higher education in delivering the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by fostering empathy, sensitivity, sensitivity, and responsibility for others. Disciplinary knowledge alone is not enough – universities must equip equip students with social and emotional (EQ) competences competences so that they can become conscious citizens citizens and leaders of change.

- **WP3 Emotional Intelligence for the SDGs** addresses this addresses this need by developing tools for teaching teaching empathy (trainings, a summer school, and the and the EQ board game).

WHO are the core beneficiaries

The primary beneficiaries are university students, who will develop their social and emotional competences and earn micro-credentials confirmed by digital badges. They are expected to become **AGENTS OF CHANGE**, actively **co-creating a new university culture** based on empathy, shared responsibility, and genuine engagement with the SDGs. HOW partners work together to deliver change

WP3 Emotional Intelligence for the SDGs

EQ-related activities coordinated by Team Coaching (board game, summer school hosted by RTU, awareness video led by ABD).



WP4 Micro-credentials for the SDGs

Micro-credential system and digital badges coordinated by UAB and ACEEU, with design by Team Coaching.



WP5 Dissemination

Webinars, publications, a final conference, and the "University Roadmap to SDGs", coordinated by ACEEU and ABD.

WHAT results or impact are expected

The project aims to transform the quality of studying – making it a **formative process of responsibility and action**, rather than just acquiring subject knowledge. Students, as **agents of change**, will not only participate in learning processes but will also **shape a new academic culture** – one based on empathy, responsibility, and collaboration for the SDGs. Their engagement will inspire both the academic community and wider society.

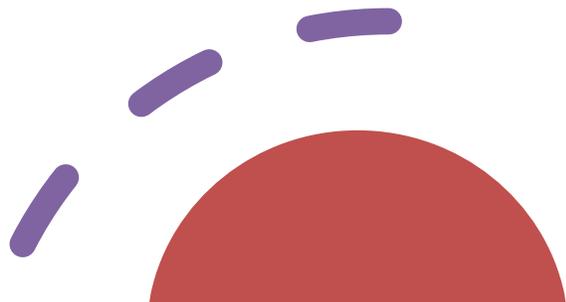
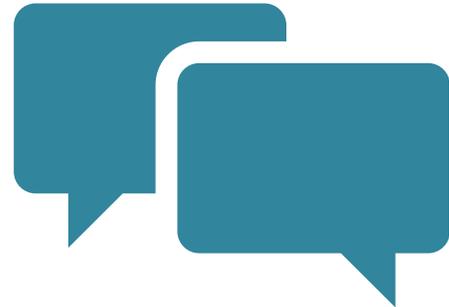

Assessment Criteria for Relevance

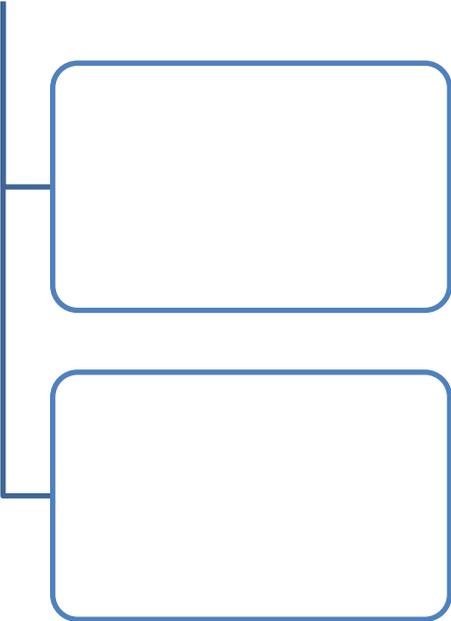
Extent to which...

- Proposal is relevant to the OBJECTIVES and PRIORITIES of the funding action: proposal will be considered highly relevant if it addresses the priority “inclusion and diversity”.
- Proposal is relevant for respect/promotion of EU VALUES and fighting discrimination.
- **PROFILE, EXPERIENCE and ACTIVITIES** of the participating organisations are relevant to the field of application.
- Proposal is based on a genuine and adequate **NEEDS ANALYSIS**.
- Proposal is suitable for creating SYNERGIES between different fields of education, training, youth and sport or has potential for strong impact on one of these fields.
- Proposal is **INNOVATIVE**.
- Proposal is COMPLEMENTARY to other initiatives already carried out by the participating organisations.
- Proposal brings **ADDED VALUE AT EU LEVEL** through results that would not be attained by activities carried out in a single country.

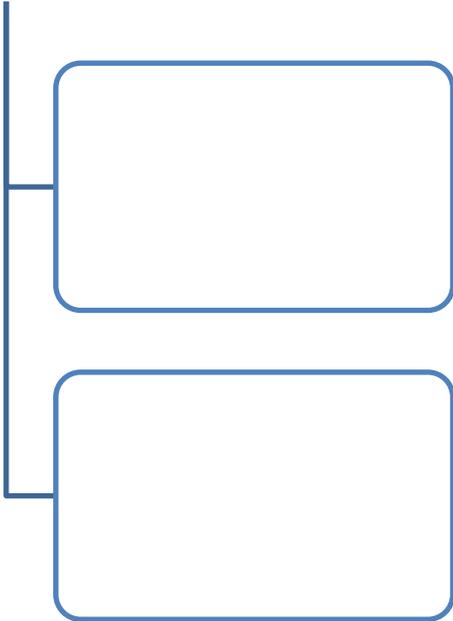

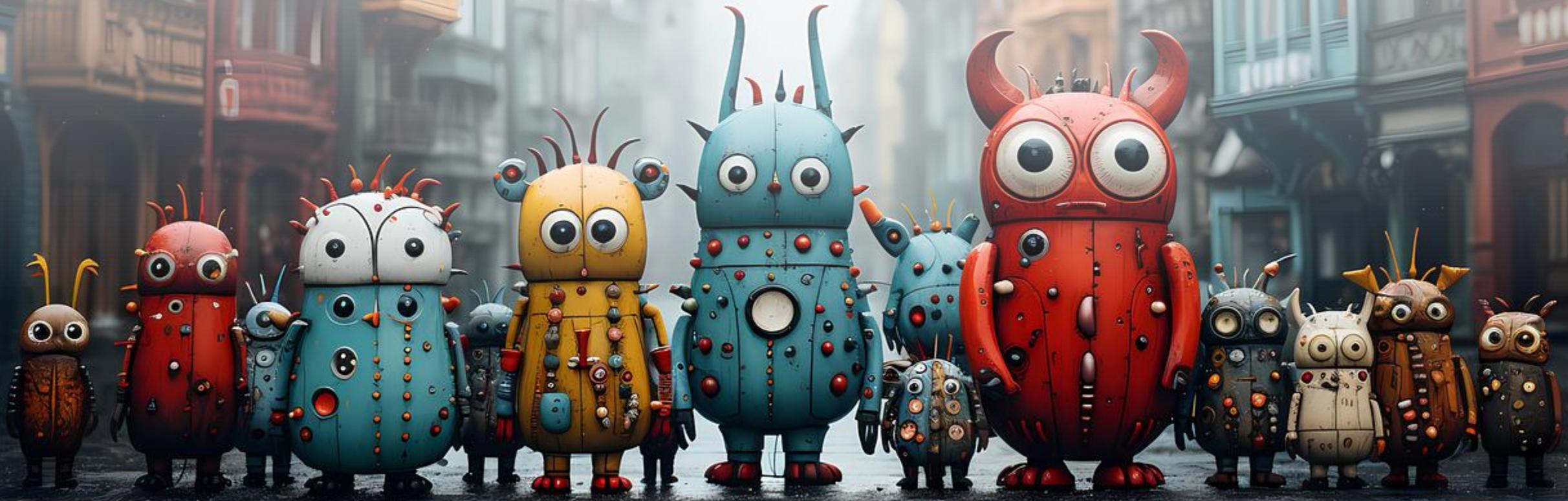
Plenary Review

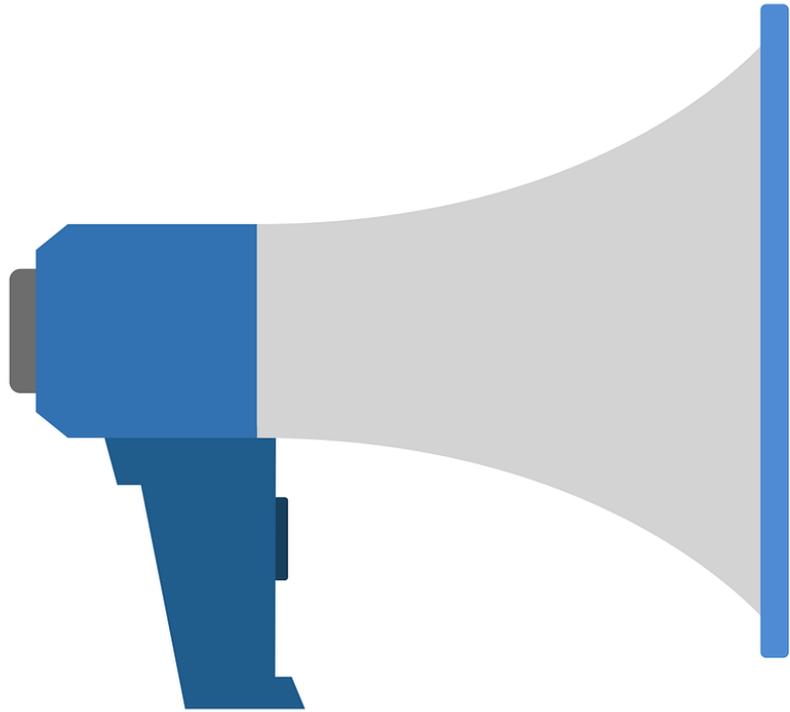
Diagram structure for Collaboration and Outreach:

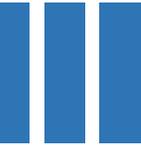

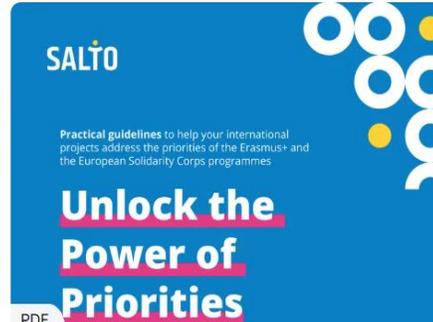
