Fostering inclusive approaches for mobility and cooperation activities, including support for Ukraine



Green

Stimulating more environmentally friendly practices and teaching practices to tackle climate change and biodiversity loss



Digital

Supporting digital capabilities of the higher education sector through the European Student Card Initiative and the development of digital skills



Participatory

Stimulating participation and civic engagements



Erasmus 2021-2027

- **Key Action 1:** Learning mobility of individuals (KA131 + KA171)
- **Key Action 2:** Cooperation among organisations and institutions
- **Key Action 3:** Support for policy development and cooperation

Erasmus+ higher education mobility – **new** mobility types in KA131 since 2021

Mobility activities:

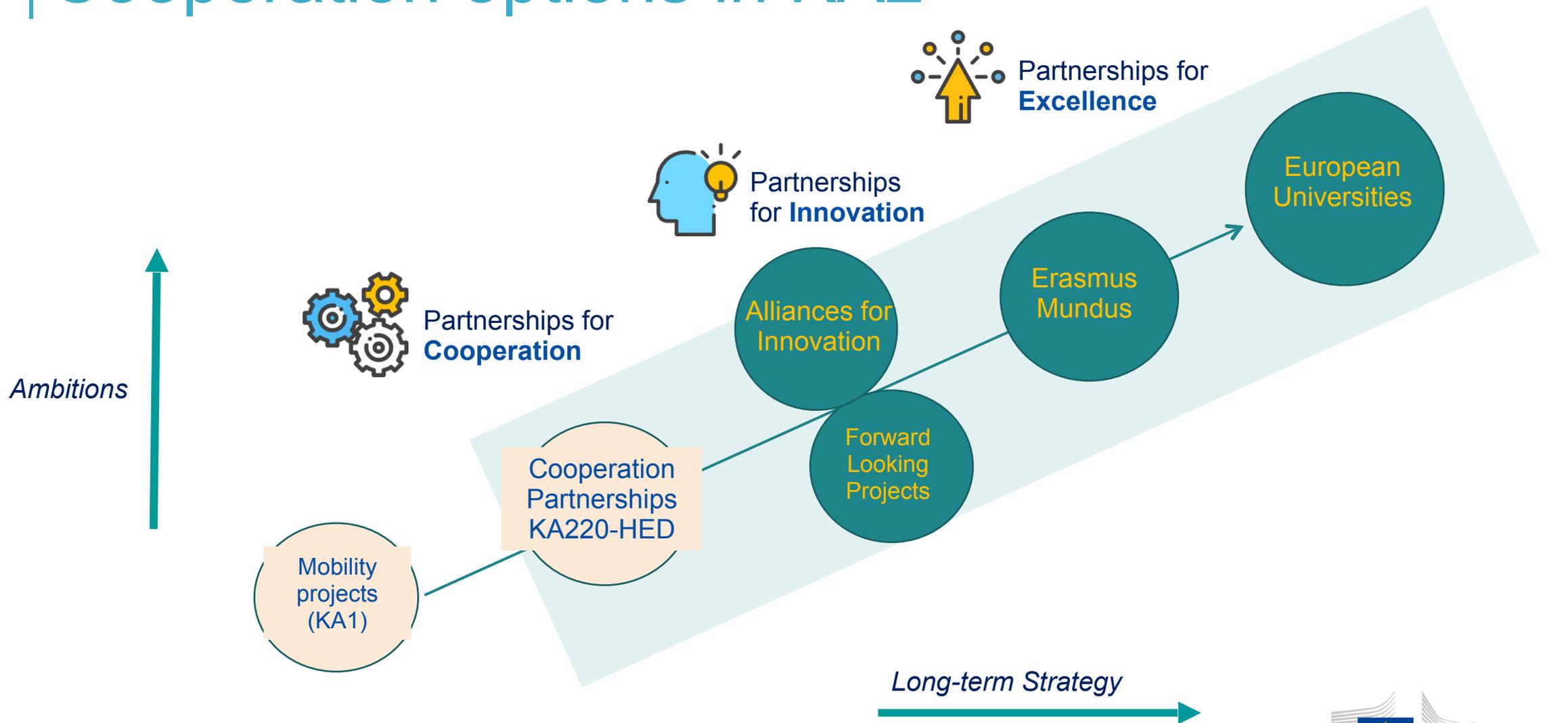
- Student mobility for studies:
 - **Short-term (if blended) > 5-30 days**
 - Long-term > **2-12 months**
- Student mobility for traineeships:
 - **Short-term (if blended) > 5-30 days**
 - Long-term > 2-12 months
- Staff mobility for teaching: 1-60 days
- Staff mobility for training: 2-60 days

Other activities:

- **Blended intensive programmes**

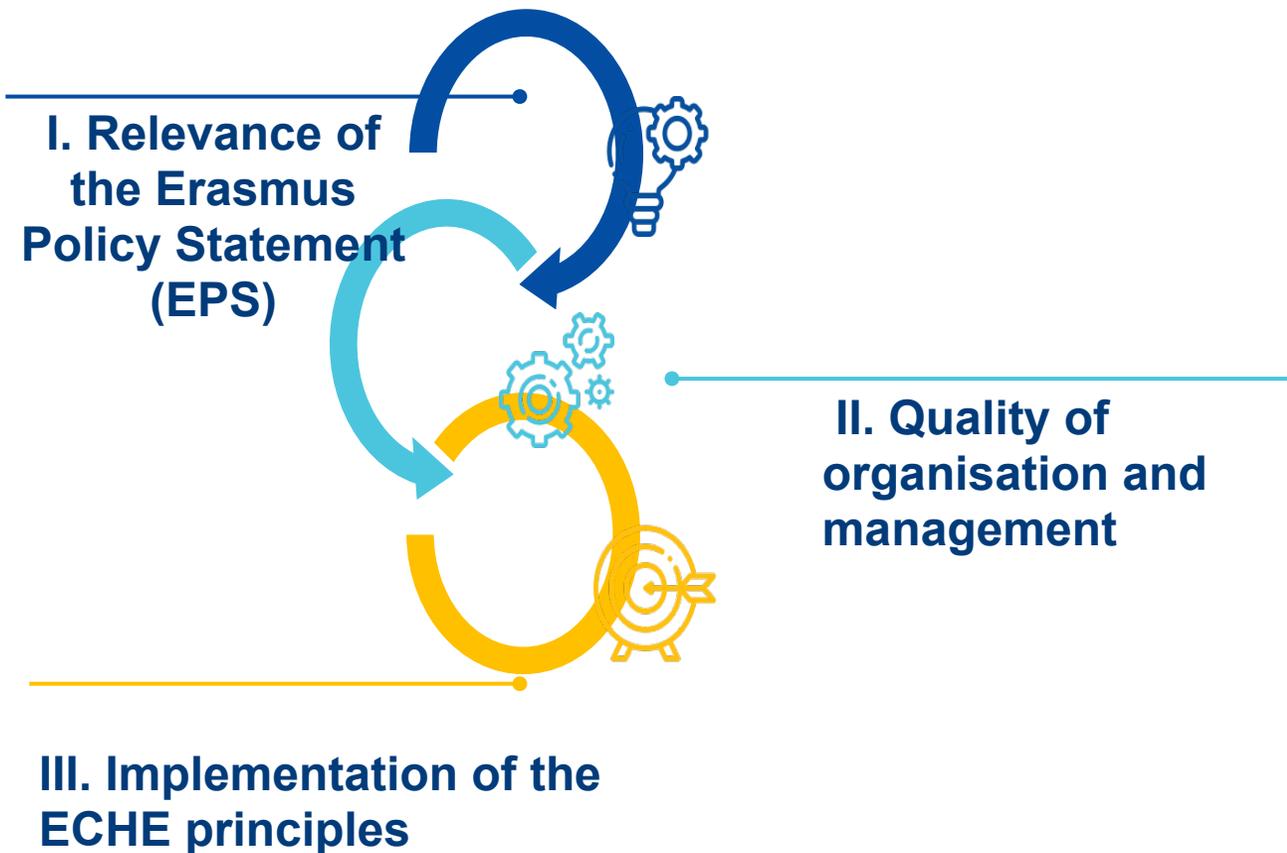
- Admissibility and Eligibility Criteria (EACEA+ NAU)
- **Award Criteria** (Experts + Evaluation Committee)

Eligible countries:

- 27 EU MS
- Recognised HEIs based in eligible countries: Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, North Macedonia, Serbia, Turkey + Albania, Bosnia Herzegovina, Kosovo and Montenegro
- Switzerland, UK, and other countries currently negotiating association agreement

How the HEI will implement the Erasmus+ actions

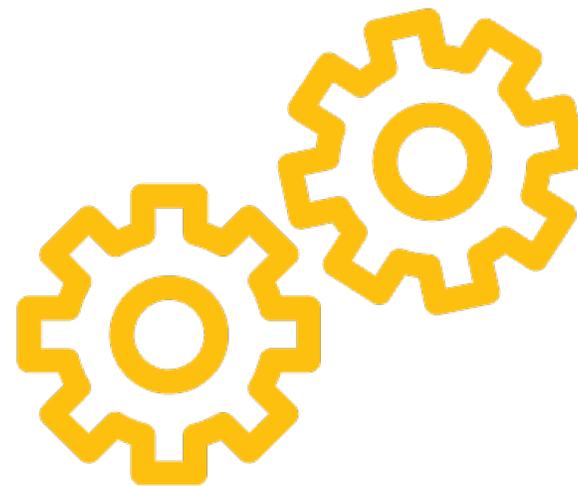

3.1 ECHE fundamental principles

3.1.1 Non-discrimination, transparency and inclusion

- *What measures are taken to respect the principles of non-discrimination, transparency and inclusion?*
- *How will the HEI ensure **equal access to opportunities**, paying attention to participants with fewer opportunities?*

3.1.2 ECTS credits

- *What is the methodology of allocating ECTS to courses?*
- ***If they don't use ECTS credits they explain why** or how they will do it in the future*

3.1.3 European Student Card and Erasmus+ App

- *How will the HEI implement the European Student Card Initiative and promote the E+ App?*
- ***How will the HEI adapt their procedures do digitalise mobility?***

3.1.4 Environmentally friendly practices

- *How will environmentally friendly practices in the **context of Erasmus+** be implemented and promoted by the HEI?*

3.1.5 Civic engagement and active citizenship

- *How will civic engagement and active citizenship be **promoted for incoming and outgoing** students?*

3.2 Mobility activities

3.2.1 Course catalogues

- How will the HEI display **information on courses taught**, in accordance with the EU Recommendation on Automatic Mutual Recognition

Implementation of ECHE principles in general

- What we want to see:
 - Familiarity with existing information published by the European Commission on these activities
 - For example: inclusion and diversity strategy, ESCI, green strategy, ECTS users' guide for example, learning agreement guidelines
 - Explanations of the measures taken in the HEI to respect these principles
 - Concrete ideas
 - Examples
 - Strategies
 - All questions answered



European Student Card Initiative (ESCI) - 3 building blocks

- **Erasmus Without Paper**

- Connect all universities in E+ countries via a digital network - Erasmus Without Paper (EWP) Network
- Offer a software for institutions without mobility management systems - EWP Dashboard

- **European Student Card**

- Ensure students can confirm their status abroad

- **Erasmus+ App**

- Offers students information on the mobility process, tips, etc.

- Greener administration through paperless workflows
- Efficiency gains for mobility management through the once only principle
- Smoother mobility experience for students

Monitoring the ECHE

- ECHE Monitoring guide published in February 2023
- In principle the whole Erasmus charter is supposed to be monitored by the Erasmus+ National Agencies
- To focus the monitoring and support we have established three pressure points



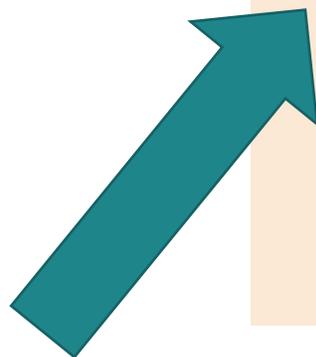
